

Civic Addressing General Principles Mt Lorne

The following principles are consistent with similar standards found throughout Canada. These principles are already being used in Tagish and in Whitehorse along the North Klondike Highway. They will be applied to other Local Advisory Areas in 2015 in order to provide a consistent addressing system that can be used by emergency service responders throughout rural areas surrounding Whitehorse. This approach is supported by the RCMP, the Fire Marshal's Office, and Emergency Medical Services:

1. Odd numbers will be on the right and even numbers on the left.
2. Numbers are based on a standard measurement guideline:
 - Country Residential Areas (all side roads) - 15 metre increments
 - Highways (including Annie Lake Road) - 32 metre incrementsEach increment includes 2 properties, so as you progress down the road, you will get:

<u>Highway – right side</u>	<u>Side Road – left side</u>
0m = No.1	0m = No.2
32m = No.3	15m = No.4
64m = No.5	30m = No. 6

For roads, the measured distance begins at the intersection where the road begins. For example:

- The distance measure for the South Klondike Highway starts at its intersection with the Alaska Highway.
 - The distance measure for Annie Lake Road starts at its intersection with the South Klondike Highway.
3. The exception to the above is Kookatsoo Lake Road, where higher density and no possibility of new lots or subdivisions allow for a standard urban address system.
 4. Civic address numbers are derived from distance measures to the nearest corner of a lot on the road – not by distance measures to a driveway. Sometimes this is an approximate measure because some lots have an unconventional shape or orientation to the road.
 5. Generally, the civic address is applied to the road from which the main driveway is accessed.

Please note: Until further notice, lot numbers will continue to be used for land title purposes and other applications as required.

For the purpose of emergency services, residents are encouraged to use the civic address assigned to their property and to display the corresponding number visibly. Lot numbers should be taken down to avoid confusion.
