b. Response Hunting within Mt Lorne

Council received a response from Joe MacGillvray, Deputy Minister of Environment, on behalf of the Environment Minister regarding the No Hunting request in Mt Lorne.

He suggested that council propose changes to hunting regulations by contacting the Yukon Fish and Wildlife Management Board, but an amendment to the act would not be necessary to put up signage.
